Chief Executive Officer Maybank Foundation Aside from being a competitive platform, the annual MyTIGER Values Art competition & Exhibition provides a benchmark for the public in gauging the aspirations and concerns of the youth. It has always been consistent in harnessing the ideals and thoughts of the university demographic, as these circles are bound to be the most optimistic and stand to gain and lose the most from the future.

Such concerns were truly well-presented and reflected in the entries. Contestants have successfully interpreted the required TIGER values and exemplified some of the 17 sustainable development goals announced by the UN. Themes and metaphors are translated onto the surface using forms and ideas that are somewhat literal or simplistic in their approach but without detracting from the focus of their messages and concerns.

Aside from the often-cited message on a sustainable future, also on the list of notes are concerns over the encroaching digital lifestyle. The overpowering reliance on digital socialization and bartering of individual freedoms weigh heavily. It is refreshing to see these observations to understand today's generation that is still equally concerned about the worrying trends— just like the generation before them.

However, missing from the entries are other popular issues in the global conversation, such as identity politics—which is being featured as one of the UN's 17 goals. This may be considered as a sign of apathy or lack of concern among youths in this region on such triviality and virtue-signaling matters—an issue that is currently championed by the west. Contestants are more concerned with things rooted in the reality that affect their practical and pragmatic life or conditions. Their strife in search of harmony as a community has become more important than investment in individualistic pursuits.

Amidst the difficulties in organising a nationwide competition post-Covid, Maybank had managed to, once again, keep the annual event going. The juries congratulate Maybank for its effort to conduct an online competition, despite the ongoing difficulties of having a physical judging session. In the future, the online or physical judging process should be more equipped with proper tools to detect derivative works and potential plagiarism to maintain the integrity and accountability of the competition. This action will hopefully help the competition to become a more highly regarded event deserving of its benchmarks.

JURIES' NOTE

With the coming edition of the event, it is also encouraged to have both an online and physical platform to bring in more participation. Perhaps, by adding more categories and offering higher rewards, better entries from more prestigious art schools can be submitted. MYTiger Values Art Competition should become a highly anticipated art event among the young professional of the Arts.

The wide varieties and methods for interpretation provided us with many differing views, but unfortunately, it also had the effect of over-shining some other expressions. A horizontal view of selected finalists showed highly fluctuating executions and styles. Due to the many interesting forms of expression, choosing a winning entry was an arduous task. This is reflected in the final votes by the juries, with the winning entry receiving a slight margin compared to the next. In the final decision, the best winning entries that exemplified sound ideals and strong skills, as well as effective messaging, were chosen.

The current edition of the competition could be summed up as a strong continuation of a growing tradition from Maybank. With sincere admiration and appreciation, it is with hope and gratitude that we continue to collaborate and look forward to the next edition of the competition.

INFO ON GLOBAL TIGER DAY

The tiger is the largest of the world's big cats and this magnificent creature, with its distinctive orange and black stripes and beautifully marked face, has a day that is dedicated to it. Global Tiger Day is an annual celebration to raise awareness for tiger conservation, held annually on 29 July. It was created in 2010 at the Saint Petersburg Tiger Summit.

The goal of the day is to protect the natural habitats of tigers and to raise public awareness and support tiger conservation issues. This was in response to the shocking news that 97% of all wild tigers had disappeared in the last century, with only around 3.900 left in the wild.

Tigers are on the brink of extinction and Global Tiger Day aims to bring attention to this fact and try to halt their decline. Many factors have caused their numbers to fall, including habitat loss and poaching. Global Tiger Day aims to protect and expand their habitats and raise awareness of the need for conservation. Many international organisations are committed to this day, including the WWF, the IFAW and the Smithsonian Institute.

DETAILS OF MAYBANK EFFORT IN TIGER CONSERVATION PROGRAMME

Tigers are a national treasure, as well as the symbol of bravery and strength, the virtues that Maybank adheres to in the creation of its T.I.G.E.R values. In a collaboration with WWF-Malaysia for its Strengthening Tiger Conservation in the Belum-Temenggor Forest Complex programme, Maybank is one of Malaysia's leading organisations that is spearheading the tiger conservation effort in the country. Maybank Foundation has pledged RM5 million over 4 years of the programme that has commenced since 2016. Maybank, as the leading bank in Malaysia and one of the leaders in South East Asia, is committed towards fulfilling some of the objectives of the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Through its efforts with WWF-Malaysia in conserving tigers in the Royal Belum Forest Complex, Maybank will be trying to fulfil the SDG 15, which is to sustainably manage forests and halt biodiversity loss. 3 strategies have been underpinned to ensure the success of the programme:

Protection

- Introducing SMART patrolling in the Royal Belum State Park and Temenggor Forest Reserve to ensure comprehensive protection of the Belum-Temenggor Forest Complex.
- Advocating for greater effectiveness in protecting the Belum-Temenggor Forest Complex by introducing the minimum protected area standards for tigers.

Monitoring

- Monitoring the population of Malayan tigers and their preys to evaluate if the number of individuals changes through various non-invasive methods such as camera trapping.
- Improving knowledge on the tigers and their preys to better understand the best possible course of action.

Community Engagement

- Increasing communities' awareness and participation in anti-poaching initiatives.
- Developing a potential sustainable livelihood revenue generation model to reduce communities' dependencies on natural resources from tiger habitat.

Building on the success of the programme, Maybank Foundation has kicked off the 'Strengthening Tiger Conservation in the Belum-Temenggor Forest Complex - Phase 2' to take place over 4 years. The programme is aimed at stabilising tiger population in the aforementioned priority site with enhanced priority on certain aspects of the programme. We have set certain milestones to achieve over 4 years by 2023 which will mark significant impacts on tiger conservation efforts. These include:

Since the inception of the programme, we have achieved so much in terms of preservation and conservation of tigers and impacted the wildlife surrounding and supporting them. As of 2021, the programme has already accomplished the following:

• **42,000 km** of dense forest has been covered via foot patrol in the effort to protect not just tigers and their preys, but also the ecosystem as a whole over 5 years.

 238 active wire snares have been found and deactivated. thereby potentially saving 238 large animals including tigers and their preys as they are essential to the equilibrium of the food chain.

• Addressing poaching through community participation in tiger conservation.

• Addressing the lack of effective management in the protected Belum-Temenggor Forest Complex by securing linkages from Northern Banjaran Titiwangsa to Taman Negara and securing Gunung Chamah from conversion to other land uses.

 Improving the knowledge on tigers and their preys to aid decision making by plotting the tiger density and prey occupancy in the Temenggor Forest Complex and Royal Belum State Park.

• Addressing forest conversion and fragmentation by encouraging community participation in tiger conservation through outreach programme.




